

# Chernobyl Medical Support Network 2010 Activity Report

## 1. Medical Institutions and related facilities for those affected, or businesses support relating to affected people.

### ■ Dispatch of the 10<sup>th</sup> Medical Checkup Team to Brest

We dispatched a medical checkup team which consists of medical specialists and their staff to the Republic of Belarus and carried out screenings for thyroid cancer, medical technology and medications, operating on thyroid by an endoscope by Doctor Shimizu. The details are as follows.

Support:	<i>Minsk No.10 Hospital:</i> Medical apparatuses cost a total of \$1,000. <i>Brest State Endocrine Clinic:</i> Medical apparatuses for cytology (slide glasses etc)
Checkup:	We examined 50 patients in the 2 days from October 7-8 <sup>th</sup> at Brest State Endocrine Clinic. The result was that 1 people were found to have malignant growths, 9 have indeterminate growths, 40 have benign growths.
Symposium	The lecture was held for the medical related locals. Explanation of an operation on thyroid by an endoscope by Doctor Shimizu.
Operation	Operation on thyroid by an endoscope was done by Doctor Shimizu at Minsk State Clinical Hospital. The patient was female, 29 years old. The operating time was 2 hours and 2 minutes.

### ■ Support for the local welfare workshop “Hope21”

**operated by victims and handicapped persons.**

We purchased supplies from “Hope21” twice a year and sold them at through internet, mail order through letterzine “Chernobyl Tsushin”, and at events.

During the dispatch of the 30<sup>th</sup> investigation team, we visited the welfare workshop “Hope 21”, covered the related people. We presented \$2,417 of donations from the members (“Hope21 Contributions” September 2009 – March 2010.)

### ■ Support for the local NGO “Confidence” which supports mothers and their children.

At the time of dispatch of the 30<sup>th</sup> investigation team, we covered representative, Irina Arinovich and her staff Ludmila Ukrainka. We presented \$900 to support their activities. We opened photos of their activities to the public in a new page “Confidence” on the corporate website.

## 2. Research project to understand the realities of the damage and assistance.

### ■ The dispatch of the 30<sup>th</sup> Investigation Team

The investigation team was dispatched to the Republic of Belarus and carried out coverage of medical related locals. The team was consisted of two members, Mr. Hideo Yamada, Russian language medical interpreting coordinator and Ms. Yu Terashima, Director of CMN.

Besides the investigation, they presented \$1,500 to maintain for the medical examination car “Snowman Car 2” to Belarus Red Cross and \$2,000 to purchase medical apparatuses to Brest State Endocrine Clinic

### ■ The dispatch of the 31<sup>st</sup> Investigation Team (October 5<sup>th</sup> – 16<sup>th</sup>)

The investigation team was dispatched together with “the dispatch of the 10<sup>th</sup> medical examination team to Brest”.

Visited related local agencies and carried out coverage of related people.

## 3. Informing the general public about the situation of areas damaged by the Chernobyl NPP accident and enlightenment programs for improving the welfare of victims.

### ■ Holding Study Sessions and training events

We informed to general public about our activities, the Chernobyl NPP accident and the present situation of areas damaged through the following 3 projects in Fukuoka-pref.

#### ▼ Matryoshka Painting Society(August 28<sup>th</sup>)

An event of painting plain white wood Matryoshka dolls purchased from the welfare workshop “Hope 21.”

The event was held at Fukuoka NPO Volunteer Exchange Center (Fukuoka City) by the subsidy of Yokatopia Foundation. Number of participants: 15people.

#### ▼ Charity Hair Salon Snowman (October 11<sup>th</sup>)

An event was held where haircuts were provided by professional stylists for just one day and the profits were donated to medical support on sufferers by the Chernobyl NPP accident.

The event was held at OMULA Specialist School for Beauty, Omnis Studio (Fukuoka City). The number of customers: 131 people.

The event was held by the subsidy of Fukuoka City Support Fund for NPO Activities.

#### ▼ Belarus Cooking School (December 18<sup>th</sup>)

A meeting for making and eating of homemade Belarus foods like Borschs was held in a Cooking Room, Koga-city Central Public Hall (Fukuoka-pref.) by the subsidy of Yokatopia Foundation. The number of participants: 5 people.
