

Chernobyl Medical Support Network 2011 Activity Report

1. Medical Institutions and related facilities for those affected, or businesses support relating to affected people.

■ Dispatch of the 11th Medical Checkup Team to Brest

We dispatched a medical checkup team which consists of medical specialists and their staff to the Republic of Belarus and carried out screenings for thyroid cancer, medical technology and medications, operating on thyroid by an endoscope by Doctor Shimizu. The details are as follows.

Support:	<i>Minsk No.10 Hospital:</i> Medical apparatuses cost a total of \$1,000. <i>Brest State Endocrine Clinic:</i> Medical apparatuses cost a total of \$2,000.
Symposium	The lecture was held for the medical related locals at Minsk No.10 Hospital Explanation of an operation on thyroid by an endoscope by Doctor Shimizu.
Checkup:	We examined 31 patients in the 2 days from September 28-29 th at Brest State Endocrine Clinic. The result was that 1 people were found to have malignant growths, 3 were suspected to have malignant growths, 2 had indeterminate growths, 25 had benign growths, 1 had incompatible specimens.
Operation	Operations on thyroid by an endoscope were done by Doctor Shimizu at Minsk No.10 Hospital and Brest State Hospital.

■ Support for the local welfare workshop “Hope21”

operated by victims and handicapped persons.

We purchased supplies from “Hope21” once a year and sold them at through internet, mail order through letterzine “Chernobyl Tsushin”, and at events.

During the dispatch of the 32nd investigation team, we visited the welfare workshop “Hope 21,” covered the related people. We presented \$2,835 of donations from the members (“Hope21 Contributions” April 2010 – August 2011.)

■ Support for the local NGO “Confidence” which supports mothers and their children.

At the time of dispatch of the 32nd investigation team, we covered representative, Irina Arinovich and her staff Ludmila Ukrainka. We presented \$900 to support their activities.

We received some pictures painted by Belarussian children for the victims of the Great East Japan Earthquake.

2. Research project to understand the realities of the damage and assistance.

■ The dispatch of the 32nd Investigation Team

The investigation team was dispatched together with “the dispatch of the 10th medical examination team to Brest”.

Visited related local agencies and carried out coverage of related people.

3. Informing the general public about the situation of areas damaged by the Chernobyl NPP accident and enlightenment programs for improving the welfare of victims.

■ Holding Study Sessions and training events

We informed to general public about our activities, the Chernobyl NPP accident and the present situation of areas damaged through the following 3 projects in Hiroshima and Fukuoka-pref.

▼ Debriefing session upon return to Japan of the Belarus Investigation Team (February 19th)

The debriefing session was held at Fukuoka NPO Volunteer Exchange Center.

The presenter was Medical interpreter Hideo Yamada. Number of participants: 5 people.

▼ Debriefing session on Medical Support for Chernobyl (April 23rd)

The debriefing session was held at Hiroshima Town Development Citizens Exchange Plaza. The co-sponsor was Hiroshima Medical Council for Chernobyl Support.

The presenters were and Associate professor Noriyuki Kawano and Medical interpreter Hideo Yamada. Number of participants: about 40 people.

▼ Matryoshka Painting Society (August 6th)

An event of painting plain white wood Matryoshka dolls purchased from the welfare workshop “Hope 21.”

The event was held at Fukuoka NPO Volunteer Exchange Center. Number of participants: 11 people.
